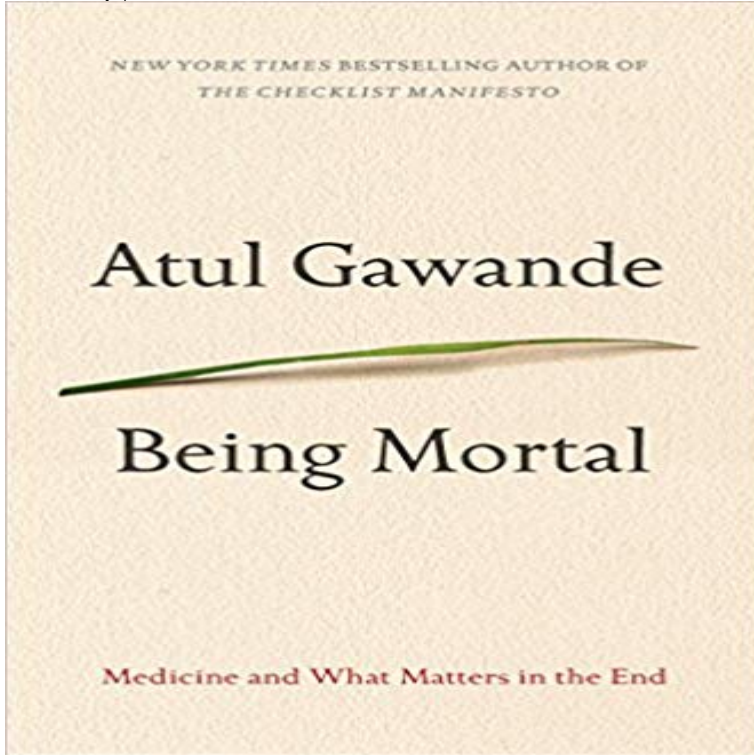


Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End
