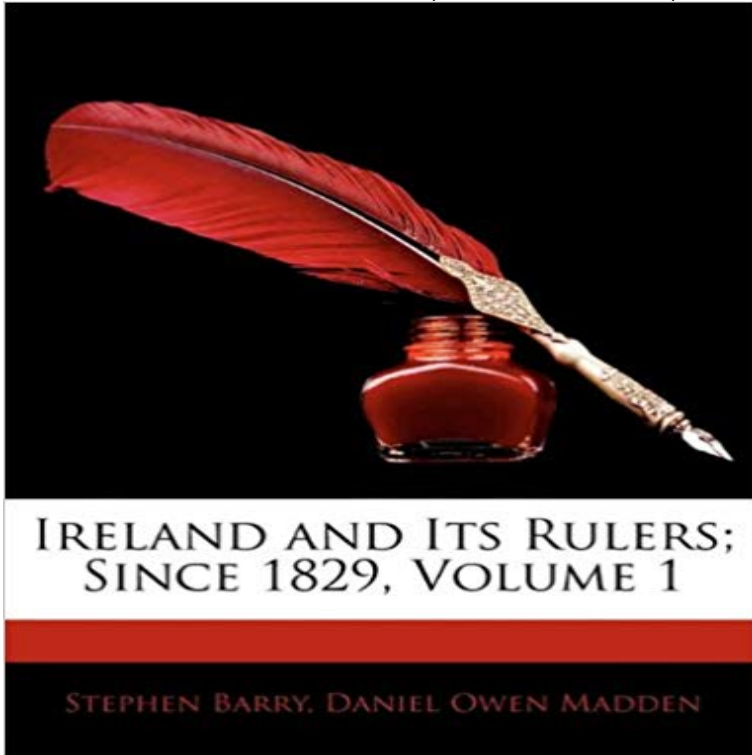


Ireland and Its Rulers; Since 1829, Volume 1
