

# Irish Childhoods: An Anthology



This is an anthology of memories and impressions of childhood by Irish writers, including W.B. Yeats, Molly Keane, Flann O'Brien, Seamus Heaney, William Trevor, James Joyce, Brendan Behan, Sean O'Casey, Brendan Kennelly and others. Over 100 pieces, arranged in chronological order, take readers from the pre-Christian world of Ireland to the tensions of modern Belfast, from the farmers cottage to the Great House, from riding horses to driving trains and provide a wonderful kaleidoscope of Irish experience.

Incredibly reflective, it harks back to childhood, to the times when we didn't. A striking feature that runs through much of this anthology is the use of the child's voice.
