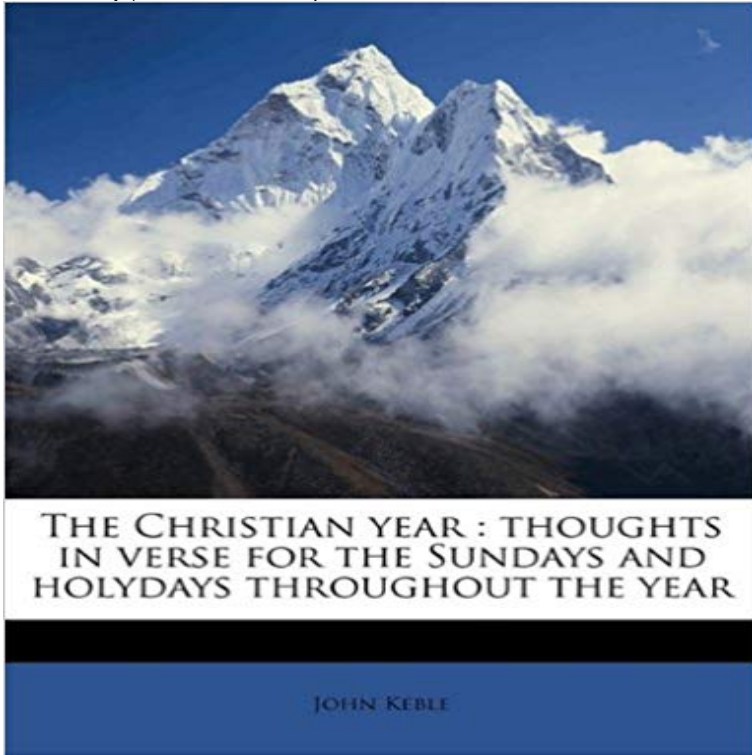


# The Christian year: thoughts in verse for the Sundays and holydays throughout the year Volume 2
