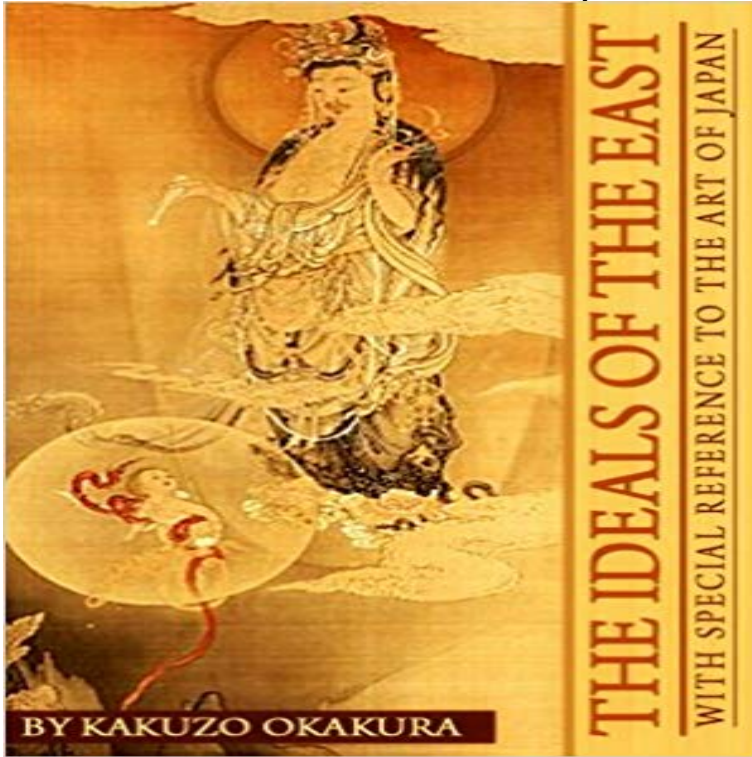


The Ideals of the East: with Special Reference to the Art of Japan
