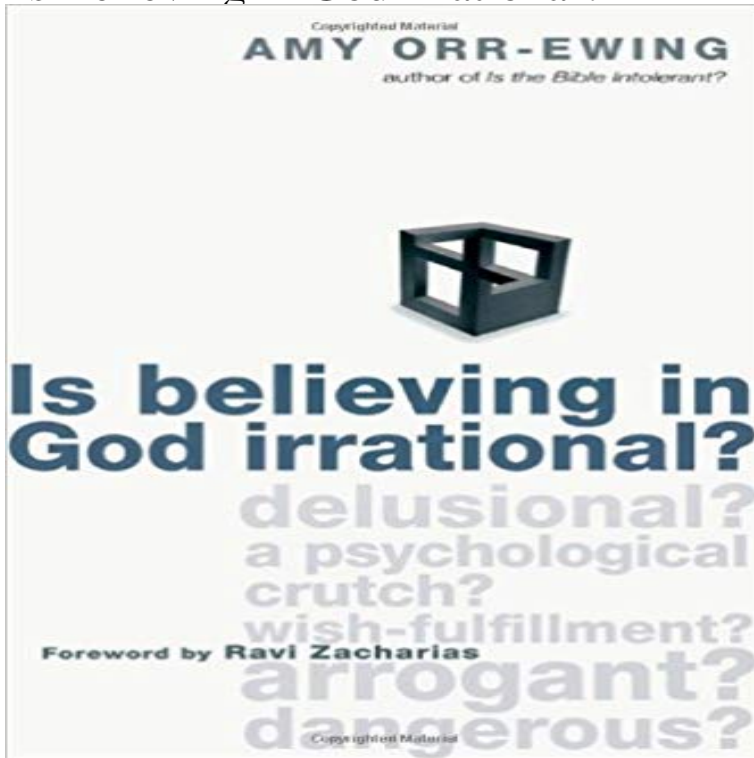


# Is Believing in God Irrational?
